I just completed some training within the law enforcement chaplaincy in trauma care and in human trafficking. But our first responders and chaplains walk into traumatic situations on a regular basis. Both of these topics were well taught, but oh the depths of the wickedness of the heart! Please pray for your first responders and the chaplains who minister to them.
